HOW TO USE CHATGPT TO OBTAIN SPECIFIC INFORMATION FROM THE NCI COMMISSIONERS' FINAL REPORT

BACKGROUND

Ken Drysdale, Lead Commissioner for the National Citizens Inquiry, has developed a comprehensive AI assistant for the Commissioners' Final Report of November, 2023.

It is in the ChatGPT app store now, and it utilizes the entire 13 volumes of the Report, so you can ask it anything.

FIRST THINGS FIRST

To use ChatGPT, head on over to http://chat.openai.com/ (ChatGPT's website) first.

Create a (free) account there, and retain your access information (username and password). NOTE: Without an account, you can't access the NCI Report GPT assistant.




HOW TO USE IT

The following screen captures give some basic direction as to how to access and then query the "assistant."


CLICK TO LOG IN




CLICK TO PROCEED




SIGN IN

BE AWARE

All Ai (like humans) can make mistakes; and most Ai tools can be affected through a programmed bias.

Since the NCI Final Report assistant draws its answers from one sole source of information, it is less likely to lead anyone astray.
